

## LUCI & IAN FAMILY GARDEN

This 4.5-acre garden connects families with the natural world by providing more than a dozen interactive and educational features made of natural materials, including a maze, a stumpery, giant bird nests, a creek and a waterfall.

## CENTRAL GARDENS

These sustainable gardens display many of the 650 different species of native plants growing throughout the Center. Here, you'll find native plants used in a variety of styles in gardens that conserve water and support wildlife.

## RESTORATION RESEARCH

In this 70-acre area, the Center studies how prescribed fire and mowing affect the growth of native grasses and wildflowers. Observe how the land responds to these management techniques applied for more than 15 years to 54 large experimental plots.

## CENTRAL COMPLEX

The Center's buildings reflect Central Texas history — sandstone epitomizes the Spanish mission settlements; limestone was commonly used by German immigrants; and corrugated tin suggests the state's modern ranches and farms.

## TEXAS ARBORETUM

The 16-acre Mollie Steves Zachry Texas Arboretum is a classic arboretum featuring a diversity of Texas trees, including a collection of oak species (Texas has the greatest diversity of oak species in the U.S.), the Hall of Texas Heroes (a collection of live oaks descended from famous trees) and the swings in the Cathedral Oaks.
